We have had a delightful beginning of both the New Year and the new semester! Students and teachers are buzzing with enthusiasm.

Second semester is filled with learning, testing and transitions. Classrooms are kicking into high gear and the pace of instruction and independent learning expectations will increase during second semester. It will be important that students stay on top of their assignments. Please check your child's AGENDA, visit teacher's Blackboard sites with your child and their password and check grades on i-Parent. You may also want to have your child sign up for the additional academic support that after school tutoring can provide.

Testing, testing, testing! The NAEP, a federally mandated national exam, will be administered to randomly selected 8th grade students on February 16, 2011. Math testing for student placement next year will also occur second semester. The dates will be shared once confirmed. Madison students will take the NMSBA, New Mexico Standards Based Assessment, beginning the week of March 21, 2011. To increase student performance on the NMSBA, Madison is using RACE questions for writing short response answers.

Transition from one level to another begins the week of January 24. La Cueva will be hosting their 8th grade Academic Orientation and Open House on January 24th at 6:30 pm in the gym. Sandia will have their 8th grade Parents/Sports Night on January 31 at 6:00 pm. We will continue to provide transition and testing information as soon as official dates are scheduled.
